Legislative Update

Alisha Hyslop, ACTE, discussed Perkins and Washington, DC:

- Implementation Rollout
- Summer authorization was atypical, unexpected to happen by July
- Big influences: CTE getting positive attention realization, bipartisan win for campaign trail, Ivanka took on as key issues and met with Senators to find a solution;
- Pressure of business community also played a key role both good and bad
- Big disagreement was how much authority the U.S. ED would have over state plans and accountability systems, which was a holdover from NCLB reauthorization debate
- Few changes around Secretary's authority added prohibitions that don't matter to us anyway like issuing regulations, longer comment periods

- Change in the way performance targets are set, states decide what performance levels should be at the beginning of the state plan, public comment process just on performance targets as part of the state plan,
- Bill was based primarily on House legislation so that was good,
- Sharing of the Bill deep dive 11:45 today
- Changes to accountability indicators:
 - PS has 3: credential, placement post program, # of CTE concentrators in non-traditional programs by gender

Secondary: Graduation rates; Science academic attainment included with English, Math, etc.; placement; non-tradional; and technical skills attainment becomes measure of program quality, where states will pick from participation in WBL, industry certification, dual enrollment

- Local needs assessment directly effects accountability and spending for local plan, self-evaluation process that includes several elements:
 - student performance data, which indicators are you doing well, which populations are doing well, which CTE programs are doing well, disaggregate
 - labor market alignment, data, talking to business/industry
 - program implementation size, scope, and quality, equity and access, barriers, inclusion, educator development
- Results drive your local application and needs for funds, strategies,
- Needs for funds must be spent on items identified in local needs assessment
- Resources ACTE is working on:
 - Regional workshops with AdvanceCTE, AACC and NAPE; three training session so far: Atlanta, Minneapolis, Phoenix, Baltimore next week
- Perkins guide published with nuts and bolts

- Hands on practical tools
- Extensive overview on LNA
- Local stakeholder engagement document
