The focus of the rebranding is to synergize CTE administrators nationwide. The association's efforts are to provide opportunities for local CTE administrators to connect through a national network of likeminded peers, contribute to building a future of shared excellence and creating ideas, innovations and best practices to help solve local challenges.

NCLA does not compete with the ACTE Administrative Division but rather provides another vehicle for the local administrator to contribute and grow professionally. NCLA is an affiliate organization with the ACTE Administrative Division. NCLA's membership is 900+.

NCLA provides up-to-date laser focused professional development. The signature event for the association is the annual Best Practices and Innovations in Career and Technical Education conference. ACTE has Joined with NCLA as a partner in this premier conferences designed specifically for the local CTE administrator. Next year's conference will be in September 25-27, 2019 in Tucson, Arizona. The call for presentations for the conference will open on December 14, 2018 and can be viewed at the NCLA website nota-cte.org and on the ACTE website acteonline.org
