CTE in lowa

37% of Iowa jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Iowa industries such as:

- bioscience
- transportation
- building and sites
- finance and insurance



In 2021-22, more than 21,000 high school students took at least one college credit contracted CTE course in Iowa.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Iowa, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, Iowa had:


