

CTE in Montana



34% of Montana jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Montana industries such as:

- advanced and traditional manufacturing
- agriculture and ag tech
- energy and energy tech
- ecommerce and logistics



In 2023, almost 1,000 Montana high school CTE concentrators graduated with a recognized postsecondary credential and almost 1,000 graduated having participated in work-based learning.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Montana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, Montana had:

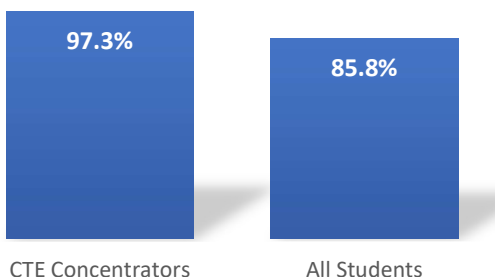
