

CTE in Nevada



34% of Nevada jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Nevada industries such as:

- health
- ag
- manufacturing
- hospitality, tourism, sports, creative



In 2022, 72% of Nevada students passed Workplace Readiness Skills Assessments.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Nevada, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, Nevada had:

76,884

secondary CTE participants

25,866

postsecondary CTE participants

These youth and adult learners in CTE programs are more engaged, graduate high school at higher rates, earn industry-recognized credentials, and have rewarding and family-sustaining careers.
