- health care and social assistance
- arts, entertainment and recreation
- transportation and warehousing
- tourism









In 2023, 94% of New York high school CTE concentrators pursued postsecondary education, joined the military or the Peace Corps, or entered the workforce immediately after graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in New York, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, New York had:


