## **CTE in South Dakota**

**36%** of South Dakota jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key South Dakota industries such as:

- manufacturing
- livestock development
- bioscience
- cybersecurity



In 2023, more than 2,360 South Dakota high school CTE concentrators participated in a Capstone Experience course aligned to their career interests and incorporating industry mentorship.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in South Dakota, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, South Dakota had:


