CTE in Virginia

29% of Virginia jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Virginia industries such as:

- controlled environment ag
- semiconductors
- life sciences
- supply chain management



In 2023, more than 19,000 Virginia high school CTE concentrators participated in work-based learning before graduating.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Virginia, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, Virginia had:


