

CTE in New Jersey



58K jobs that require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree are open annually in New Jersey. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key New Jersey industries such as:

- manufacturing
- financial services
- pharmaceuticals
- transportation and logistics



In 2023, 58% of New Jersey high school CTE concentrators participated in work-based learning before graduating.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in New Jersey, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, New Jersey had:

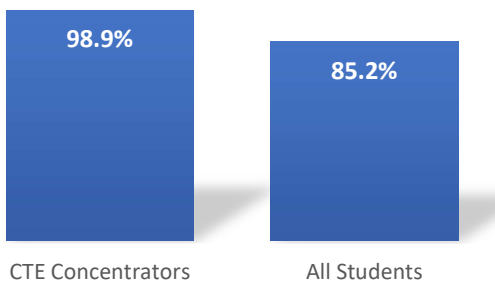
